#### Incarceration at a glance

Of all counties in California in 2022, Butte County has the ninth highest arrest rate of Black people.

### **Butte County has:**

- 1 county jail
- O state prisons
- 3 juvenile facilities

On an average day in 2022, there were 524 people in county jails and 752 people from Butte County in the state prison system.

In 2022, law enforcement agencies made 7,178 arrests and 8,497 county jail admissions, and courts sentenced 316 people to state prison.




**76 percent of all arrests** in Butte County in 2022 were for **misdemeanors**.

In 2022, Butte County used 53% of its total general fund spending on the criminal legal system. That's \$98 million that could have been spent on the things proven to make communities safer: good schools, jobs, housing, and health care.
